

Course Description

CRW2001 | Creative Writing 1 | 3.00 credits

Imaginative writing in selected genres.

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate a basic understanding of the formal elements of fiction and poetry by:

- 1. Identifying plot, character, conflict, setting, voice, point of view, resolution, and epiphany
- 2. Identifying poetic line, poetic cadence, image, simile, metaphor, dramatic monologue
- 3. Recognizing the basic principles of poetic form and distinguishing between metrical verse and free

Competency 2: The student will apply his/her understanding of the formal elements in fiction and poetry by:

- 1. Composing poems in both metrical and non-metrical forms
- 2. Composing short stories employing various characters, points of view, settings, and conflict
- 3. Presenting clear, carefully considered responses to student writing and to professional models in a class workshop format

Competency 3: The student will develop a sense of literary aesthetics by:

- 1. Writing stories and poems that demonstrate the relationship between form and content
- 2. Evaluating sample and peer works in terms of formal and aesthetic concerns

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate an understanding of the process of revision by:

- 1. Identifying differences between editing and revision
- 2. Revising stories and poems after they have been critiqued
- 3. Suggesting specific revisions to fellow students in the workshop setting

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Demonstrate knowledge of ethical thinking and its application to issues in society
