

## **REVEST ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

In this list we have attempted to gather a comprehensive list of documents that show statuses conferring eligibility for ORR programs in this case REVEST.

Individuals with the following statuses are eligible for REVEST services:

- Individuals paroled as **refugees or asylees from any country.**
- Cuban and Haitian entrants with a granted parole status.
- Cuban and Haitian entrants with an application for asylum pending.
- Iraqi, Afghan and Ukrainian Special Immigrants.

### **Acceptable documents for individuals paroled as refugees or asylees.**

- I-94 Arrival/Departure record.
- I-766 Employment Authorization Document with code A04.

### **Acceptable documents for Cuban and Haitian entrants.**

- I-94 Arrival/Departure record.
- Cuban or Haitian passport with 212(d)(5) stamped.
- I-766 Employment Authorization Document with code A04, C11, C10 or C08.
- DHS form I-862 “Notice to Appear”
- DHS form I-220A “Order of release on Recognizance”
- USCIS receipt for filing form I-589 “Application for Asylum”

### **Acceptable documents for new categories of ORR-eligible Ukrainian populations and other non-Ukrainian individuals displaced from Ukraine.**

- I-94 noting humanitarian parole.
- Foreign passport with DHS/CBP admission stamp noting “DT”, “U4U” (Uniting for Ukraine), or “UHP” (Ukrainian Humanitarian Parole)
- I-766 Employment Authorization Document with code C11.

### **The following Afghan populations are eligible for REVEST classes.**

- Citizens or nationals of Afghanistan (including unaccompanied minors) paroled into the United States under section 212(d)(5) of the Immigration and Nationality Act between July 31, 2021 and September 30, 2022.
